Perspectives on Fracking in Michigan

Our Midland League is co-sponsoring a program with the Chippewa Nature Center on hydraulic fracturing ("fracking") in Michigan, to be held **March 7**, from 7 to 8:30 pm, at the Chippewa Nature Center, 400 South Badour Road*.

Fracking is the process used to release natural gas from rock by means of injecting fluids into the ground at high pressure to fracture the rock. The practice is a subject of increasing interest due to major changes in the well drilling process used.

The program will feature presentations by Hal Fitch, State Geologist with the Office of Oil, Gas & Minerals, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality; and by Chiara Barbier and Jacque Rose, co-founders of the Friends of the AuGres-Rifle Watershed. Topics to be covered include the geology, process, regulatory aspects, and environmental considerations. Although fracking has attracted a lot of attention nationally (even globally), our program will focus on the practices and issues in Michigan.

This free program is open to the public and promises to be an excellent opportunity to hear various perspectives on the subject. We encourage you to come and invite others who may be interested.

Here is the corrected profile of Gila Mohadjer: Gila Mohadjer (pronounced Zhila) was born in Iran and grew up in Germany. She and her husband moved to Midland 14 years ago so her husband could work for Dow Chemical Co. Gila received her high school diploma in Iran at the German school in the year of the Iranian revolution before the school closed. She also earned a medical degree in Germany and decided to pursue a career in education in the medical field. She teaches human anatomy and physiology at Delta College as an adjunct. Her interest in how politics works led her to join a Great Decisions group. Three years ago she became a U.S. citizen and decided the best way to understand our laws and regulations was to become a member of the LWV. Her husband is also a citizen but their Iranian roots draw them back often; they spent Christmas vacation there. Their daughter was a college student at Alma and then went to Cambridge to get a masters degree; from there she moved to Paris and Berlin where she is earning a PhD in international relations; she has been married six months. Their son graduated from the University of Michigan and is now studying medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.
